


Brunch Down Under

Try the Big Daddy Breakfast-it's just like your mom used to cook. It includes eggs, becon, sausage, mushrooms, potatoes, baked beans and toast for ¥85. Kids under 12 eat free before 10am with adult purchase. Be sure of try one of the home-made juices concocted on site.

There's even a small range of Southeast Asian favorites like (boneless) chicken curry and Vietnamese spring rolls. The chefs speak limited English, but are always courteous and considerate, willing to tweak their dishes to suit the pickiest of eaters. And unlike your young'uns, they'll even clean up before they leave.
